In light of the unusual events of 2020, we had to take a different path! Instead of our typical live event, we had an *On-line Silent Auction*, and we chose to honor our many supporters as **SSMA Ovation People of the Year**, through whose membership, monetary donations, and Encore Thrift Shop patronage, we were able to continue our work supporting Central New York music organizations.

The auction utilized the biddingowl.com website, which exclusively serves non-profit organizations. The prizes and packages available were all donations from our generous supporters! We were able to put together 50 lots and the bidding was lively over the week-long auction. While it was not the same as a live auction, **we were able to raise close to \$4,000 for our grant program** from the safety of our homes.

SSMA GRANTS IN MUSIC PROGRAM

The Covid-19 pandemic created a most challenging situation for both SSMA and organizations that received grants for use in 2020. Because in-person performances were impossible, grant recipients were forced to innovate and reimagine their projects in order to complete them. In an effort to accommodate our grant recipients, SSMA delayed the 2020 deadlines for completion as well as for new applications, moving them forward from November 2020 to January 2021.

In February 2021, *The Syracuse Sounds of Music Association* awarded grants to twelve local, non-profit organizations. Grant recipients were selected based on an application process that requires basic information about each organization and a full description of the project(s) for which funds are being requested. The organizations selected must be located in Onondaga County, or in one of its 4 contiguous counties, and must benefit communities within them. We support groups in a variety of categories who strive to encourage and promote music, and/or music education through community outreach and performances.

2020-2021 SYMPHORIA SPONSORSHIP

SSMA proudly fulfilled our commitment to support Symphoria with our annual \$10,000 sponsorship awarded in the fall of 2020. The primary purpose of the funds was to underwrite the Holiday Pops performances. The funds also were used throughout the season to support Symphoria's Kids Concerts series and the "Kids for Free" ticket program.

The 2020 Holiday Pops concerts took place December 18th and 19th. The audience participated from home via livestream in one of three performances that weekend. Conducted by Principal Pops Conductor, Sean O'Loughlin, Symphoria played with a reduced ensemble that featured guest singer Ronnie Leigh.

Symphoria continues to find new and creative ways to connect families to orchestral music with the 3-concert Kids series. On Halloween, Symphoria offered a concert titled "Beethoven's Ghost." In February, they explained what music and science have in common with "The Science of Sound." And in April, Symphoria performed the famous "Peter and the Wolf" narrated by Chris Cresswell.

Finally, SSMA's generous sponsorship helps defer the cost of the "Kids for Free" ticket program. All audience members under the age of 18 attend any concert at no cost! This program helps to remove barriers for families wishing to introduce music to their children.
